RACE REPORT

September 17: Lone Star Le Mans @ Circuit of the Americas in Del Valle, Texas

World Endurance Championship Series (WEC)
TF Sport Racing ran their #81 Corvette in the
LMGT3 class with drivers Charlie Eastwood,
Rui Andrade and Tom Van Rompuy. The #33
Corvette raced with drivers Daniel Juncadella,
Jonny Edgar and Texan Ben Keating.

Unfortunately, the two-race podium streak c ame to an end with a 13th place finish for the #81 Corvette after six hours of rainy racing. The team lost time in the pitlane replacing a sensor on the Corvette's accident data recorder – an FIA-mandated and supplied device. This cost Andrade nearly a lap in the process.



The #33 Corvette also experienced problems. Following a strong qualifying effort and a gain of three spots under the early safety-car period, the car experienced fuel system and restart Issues on the first driver exchange between Keating and Edgar. The #33 racecar ended inside the final two hours with a right-rear suspension problem that ground the car to a halt with Juncadella at the wheel.

DXDT Racing ran their #11 Corvette in the **Pro- Am** class with drivers Matt Bell and Blake McDonald.

Chouest Povoledo Racing ran their #50 Corvette in the **Pro-Am** class with drivers Ross Chouest and Aaron Povoledo

In race two, Blake McDonald began his charge in the No. 11 DXDT Corvette. After carving his way up the order, McDonald, with just under 30 minutes remaining, first passed the #88 McLaren 720S for 2nd place. From there, he



continued to push, eventually overtaking the leader with eight minutes to go. Matt Bell and Blake McDonald delivered a brilliant drive, clawing through the field to take the Pro-Am class win for DXDT Racing!

<u>September 21: Battle on the Bricks, Indianapolis Motor Speedway, IN</u> IMSA Race series: Pratt Miller Motorsports

ran 2 cars in the **GTD PRO** class. The #3 race car was driven by Antonio Garcia and Alexander Sims. The #4 Corvette was driven by Nicky

Catsburg and Tommy Milner.

Antonio Garcia and Alexander Sims placed 4th in class in the #3 Corvette in a race that came down to fuel strategy in the second half.
Unofficially, the duo holds an 18-point advantage in the GTD PRO Drivers and Teams championships, and Chevrolet is out front by 46 points in the Manufacturers standings.



The two Pratt Miller-run Corvettes were mid-pack for most of the day. Sims qualified 3rd but stalled going into the first corner and lost track position. They ended up just ahead of teammate Tommy Milner in the #4 Corvette. A full-course yellow with just under an hour boosted the two Corvettes up the order. The #3 moved to 5th and the #4 to 6th.





Sims moved up to 4th after a hard fight with the #77 Porsche. Nicky Catsburg, Milner's teammate, was caught up in the battle also. Unfortunately, the #4 received an incident responsibility penalty as part of that battle and eventually finished 6th in class.

In the GTD class, AWA ran the #13 Corvette with drivers Matt Bell, Orey Fidani and Lars kern.

AWA's No. 13 Corvette also finished 6th in class after steadily working their way through the field. The AWA Corvette ran as high as 2nd in class before a late-race penalty knocked it down to 10th place. Bell managed to drive back to 6th at the end.

DXDT ran the #36 Corvette with Robert Wickens and Alec Udell driving. DXDT Racing's day came to an early end after the No. 36 Corvette hit the Turn 14 wall barely 90 minutes into the race. That came not too long after it was hit and spun by a prototype, then jumped a curb.

Ferrari looked set to secure its 2nd victory of 2025 until news filtered out that the car had been hit with a five-second penalty for having too many team members in the fast lane during its final pit-stop.



Initially, that did not look as though it would be too great a problem as the Ferrari was almost ten seconds faster than the closest rival Charlie Eastwood in the #81 TF Sport Corvette. But a slow final lap enabled the Irishman to close the gap to within two seconds of the silver Ferrari. With the penalty applied, this translated into the first triumph of the season for TF Sport!



APPLE RUN TO OAK GLEN 2025

October 20, Monday



MEETING PLACE: Parking lot by Krispy Kreme (1199 Atresia Blvd. Gardena 90247)

MEETING TIME: 9AM, with a 930AM departure

ROUTE: Enter **91** east to **10** freeway. Off 10, take Yucaipa Blvd. exit, drive straight to Oak Glen Rd. on the left. (big Oak Glen sign)

NOTES

- 1. First stop: Stater Bros. Market (11365 Bryant St. Yucaipa, 92399) right side parking lot.
- **2. Second Stop**: Back on Oak Glen Rd. east to Oak Glen town, stop at Apple Annies for shops. (38480Oak Glen Rd.)
- **3. Lunch:** Back on Oak Glen Rd. east to Los Rios Ranch for a BBQ lunch. (39611 Oak Glen Rd.) Suggest buy fresh apples and apple pies here.
- 4. Returning home: Take Oak Glen Rd. south to 10 freeway or 60 freeway
- 5. Recommendations: BRING WALKIETALKIE and possibly a folding chair
- **6. Other:** Sorry, no map
