

RACE REPORT

Sept. 10th, WEC raced at Six Hours of Fuji in Oyama, Japan

Corvette Racing chose an aggressive strategy of completing the race with only 4 pit stops compared to 5 for most of its competitors. Ben Keating began in the pole position for his class due to a fantastic run in the qualifying session.

Unfortunately, near the end of his driving stint, Keating came in a side-to-side contact with a Ferrari that resulted in a banged up right door. The crew quickly repaired hinges and replaced the door during the second pit stop as Nico Verrone took over the wheel.

As if this wasn't bad enough, the judges assessed responsibility for the accident to Verrone, resulting in a 30 second "Stop and Go Penalty". Despite all that, Verrone managed to get back to the lead with 90 minutes remaining.

But then the Corvette was assessed a 10 second pitlane penalty for contacting another GTE car near the end of his stint. Argh!! This left the Corvette in 3rd place with 65 minutes left in the race and Nicky Catsburg driving. By the end of the race, Catsburg was not able to improve his standing and crossed the finish line in 3rd place.

But wait, there's more! The Ferrari ahead of Catsburg was assessed a 10 second penalty, which moved the #33 Corvette to a 2nd place podium finish!

Race Results: 1st: Ferrari, 2nd: Corvette, 3rd: Ferrari. There were 13 cars in the class.

The #33 Corvette team has 1st place locked up for the season!

Sept. 15-17, IMSA raced at Indianapolis Motor Speedway Road Course

In this race, Jordan Taylor qualified the No. 3 Corvette C8.R for 5th in his class. This wasn't the start they were hoping for. But thanks to a speedy pit stop for fuel, tires and a driver change to Antonio Garcia, the No. 3 Vette jumped ahead of the No. 14 Lexus in the pitlane and restarted 3rd in class.

Despite having no slower traffic ahead, Garcia was helpless to hold off the challengers behind him. Antonia Garcia quoted "Once we went back to green and no one was holding us up, there was no chance to stay with the leaders."

Corvette Racing seemed powerless to challenge for a repeat win. In the end, Corvette Racing struggled home to a 5th place finish in the GT Daytona (GTD) PRO class.

Race Results: 1st: Mercedes, 2nd: Aston Martin, 3rd: Lexus, 4th: Porsche, 5th: Corvette. By the way, there were only five cars in the class.

The IMSA Corvette race team had hopes of building up enough points to move ahead in ranking for the season. However, the team remains in 2nd place for the season.

Oct: 11-14, IMSA next race: Michelin Raceway Road Atlanta in Braselton, Georgia.

This will be the last IMSA race for Corvette this year.

Nov. 2nd, WEC next race: 8 Hours of Bahrain

This will be the last race for WEC and Corvette this year.

HISTORICAL REPORT

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK & MOUNT RUSHMORE

SATURDAY SEPT. 9 - SATURDAY SEPT. 23

Day 1, Sat Sept. 9





We departed from **IN-N-OUT Burger** in Redondo Beach.

Successful drive to North Las Vegas; stopping at **Peggy Sue's 50s diner.** We were very Lucky, even though the place was packed, there was a table that fit all 13 of us empty and waiting for us. The service was amazing and so was the food.

We all were exhausted, returned to our rooms for some well deserved rest.
















Day 10. Mon., Sept. 18
